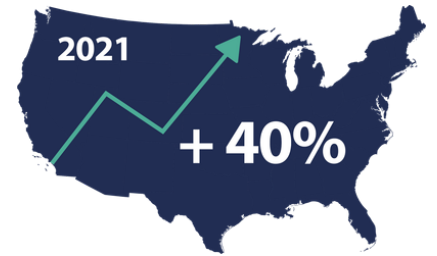

The U.S. Has The Highest Pregnancy-Related Death Rate Among Developed Nations

The United States is confronting a critical public health crisis concerning maternal mortality. Alarming, this rate increased by an astonishing 40% in 2021 and despite a decline in 2023, the U.S. continues to have the highest pregnancy-related death rate among developed countries.



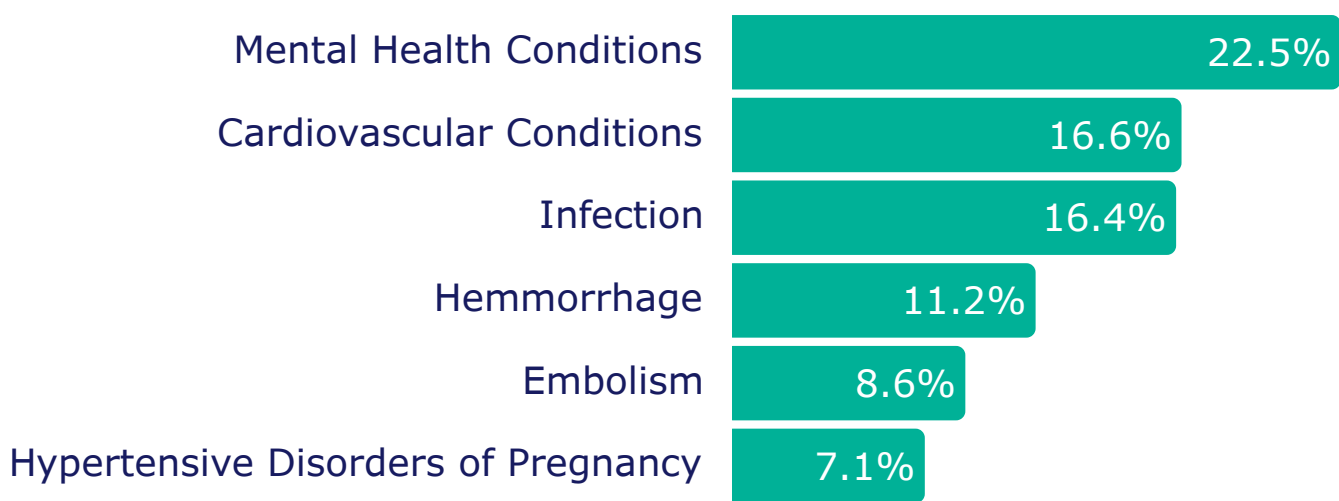
Family Connects Is A Universal Solution To A Preventable Crisis

Access To High-Quality Care Before, During, & After Pregnancy Can Prevent Maternal Mortality & Morbidity

At Family Connects, we believe that universal in-home nurse visits can help address the critical needs of families during the postpartum period.

Many new parents, especially those in underserved communities, face barriers to receiving timely, high-quality medical attention. Maternity care deserts, and a lack of coordinated postpartum follow-up contribute to preventable complications and poor outcomes.

By identifying risks early, facilitating access to care, and providing education and support, the program is working to save lives and promote long-term health for babies and their families.

Family Connects nurses educate families on maternal health warning signs from the comfort of the family home and provide guidance on the appropriate steps to take if any concerns arise.
